To whom it may concern,

Hello, I'm writing to you today to express concern and opposition to CUP-00358-2024 (Project SPUD).

As indicated on the site plan, there is a Hazardous Storage Building on the property. The opposition my family and neighbors (whom I believe you will hear from in person at the meeting) stems from the fact that there are homes, there is a school and not to mention a Lateral in the Adam's Ridge Sub as well as Noble Drainage and an East Lateral actually on the property designated for this Hazardous Storage Building.

Anything deemed "Hazardous" should not knowingly be stored or buried as waste near any schools, homes or near and/or above water systems.
I probably don't have to explain the danger of potential seepage into the ground.

Please deny this plan at the express request of at least some of the residents of Adam's Ridge. Not only is this dangerous but also this could potentially put future generations at a health risk. Then there's the collateral damage of property values decreasing as well.

Noted in the Project SPUD Master Application on page 2 fifth line "Project Spud would like to request a CUP for storing flammable commodities in quantities in excess of the allowable quantities shown in section 10-19-3.B." Which is also concerning. On the Narrative page lists a chart of Hazardous Liquids:

Quantities of liquids stored in the hazardous storage building(H-3)

1. One gallon or less
 - Class I Flammable Liquid • 14,688 Gallons
 - Class II combustible liquid • 29,326 Gallons
 - Corrosive Liquid • 1,176 Gallons
2. 1-5 gallons
 - Class I Flammable Liquid • 6,037 Gallons
 - Class II combustible liquid • 17,813 Gallons
 - Corrosive Liquid • 185 Gallons

3. Greater than 5 gallons

Class II combustible liquid • 189 Gallons

Yes, I read the part that indicates all of the safety measures in place ie: smoke alarms, sprinklers etc. Which may or may not help in an emergency situation but there's Also still the persistent risk of seepage into the ground and unseen/undetected odor or fumes that can over time affect human (and animal) lungs. With Oxidizing Gas And Liquid as well as 45+ TONS of Level I and Level II Aerosols, I find it hard to believe this project was even a consideration.

Also indicated on the application is 500 parking spaces. That's at least 500 more cars daily in and out of that parcel on roads that are already insufficient for the already growing and established demographic.

Again, please deny this plan completely - at least on the proposed site. There are plenty other parcels of land that would suit the needs of this plan that would be at a distance safe enough from homes, schools and water systems.

We live in the Arbor Subdivision across the street from this planned "ground storage facility of flammable, combustible, and/or corrosive liquids/materials in excess of bulk standards. . ."

We were surprised to be notified of this as this area consists of family homes, schools, and farm land. An accident at this ground storage facility would put the residents of our subdivision, as well as the surrounding ones, and the schools filled with children at risk of being exposed to toxic materials in the air and our water! If there is a leak that goes into the groundwater, it will spread to our yards and water supply!
