

- 7-9. Action Item: City Clerk providing status update of proposed licenses, Massage Establishments and Mobile Food Vendors, and requesting direction on next steps.

Councilmember Rodriguez disclosed that in October 2023 he sponsored the "We The Family" festival in downtown Nampa and had contacted various food vendors requesting their participation and at no point was there discussion on the proposed mobile food vendor ordinance. In addition, he disclosed that he had been contacted by, and met with, Rae-Ann Birney, a food truck owner, while also referring her to the City Clerk for more information on the proposed mobile food vendor ordinance. He requested Legal opinion on if there was any conflict with his participating in this agenda item. Joe Borton, Legal stated that since the ordinance is a legislative action, Council is free to discuss with members of the community to get their input as part of their decision making process and that there was no conflict.

Char Tim, City Clerk's Office presented the item to Council. Rodney Ashby, Planning & Zoning spoke on current enforcement issues and the regulation cycle of the mobile food vendor code.

Discussion ensued on fingerprinting requirement, specific date for compliance of code regulating mobile food vendors, and enforcement of regulations outside of the overnight parking.

The following direction was provided to staff regarding mobile food vendors:

- Continue with public outreach letters, including a notice on the upcoming public hearing.
- To start the compliance of current City Code regulating mobile food vendors, with the exception of the "no overnight parking" regulation, which will be temporarily paused until November 1, 2024.
- Compliance of City Code regulating mobile food vendors, in its entirety, to begin November 1, 2024.
- Remove the fingerprinting requirement from the proposed code.
- Schedule a public hearing on the proposed Mobile Food Vendor License for the April 15, 2024 meeting.
