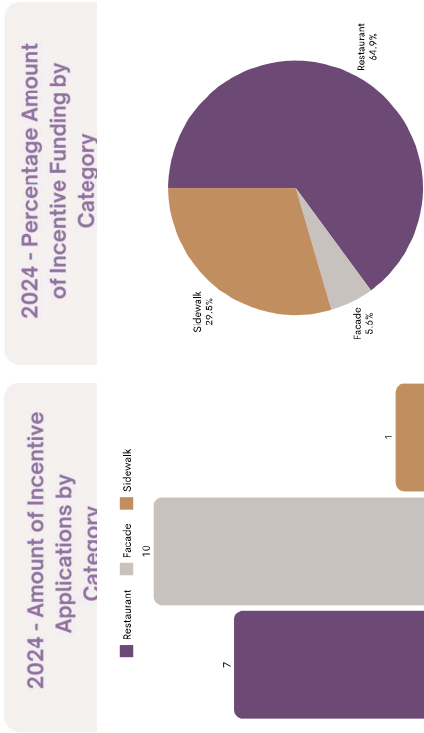

NDC partners with the City of Nampa, the Business Improvement District (BID), Downtown Nampa Association (DNA), and various others organization to improve downtown infrastructure, streetscapes, and public spaces. The agency supports development through investing in public infrastructure and utility upgrades and assisting development needed to foster economic growth and vitality.

NDC guiding documents are the 2006 Nampa Economic Development Redevelopment Plan and the Historic Mercy Hospital Urban Renewal Plan.

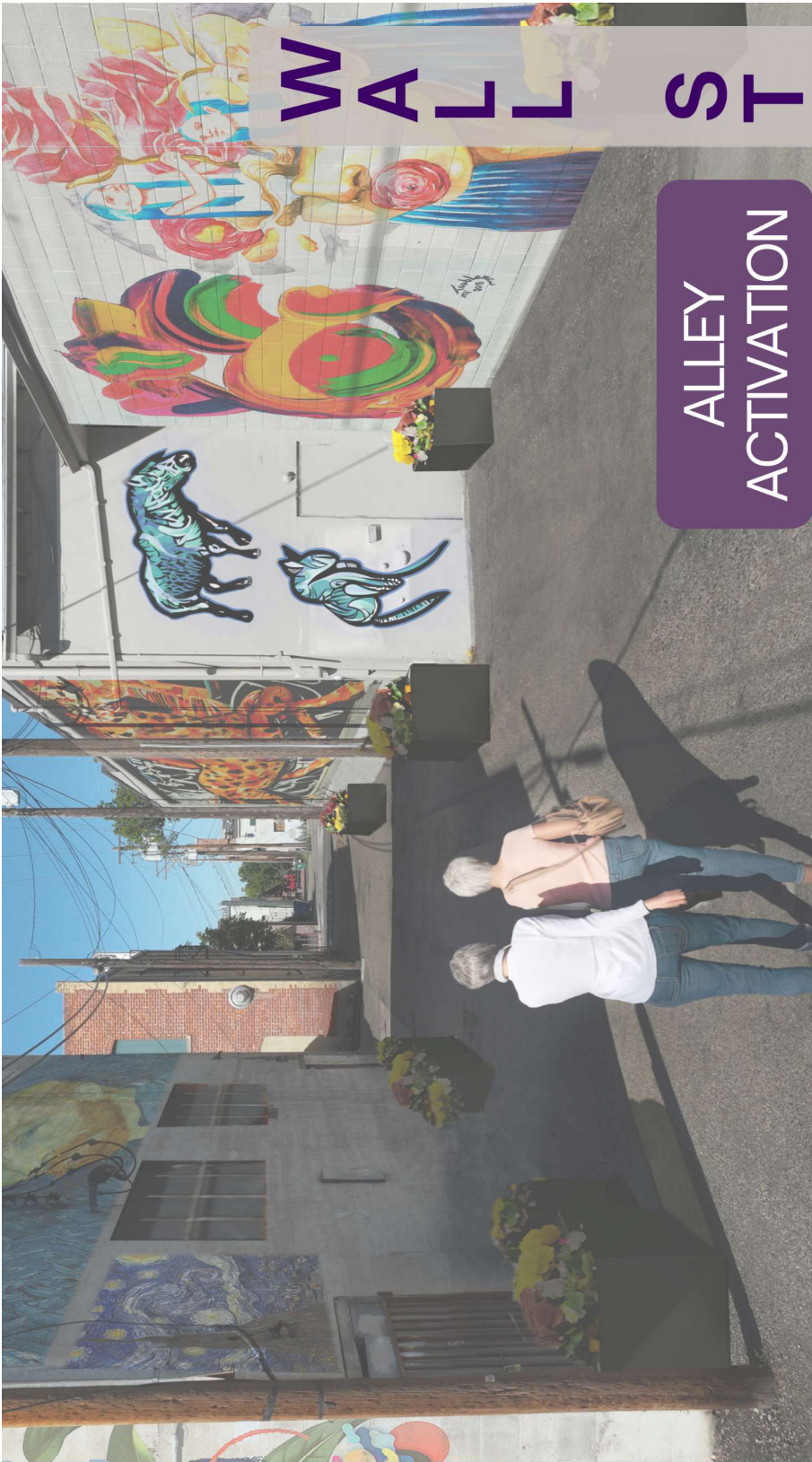




NDC continues to support downtown Nampa events including the popular monthly Third Thursday and new ticketed events.

Financial Highlights

- The Agency's total assets increased from \$25.0 million in fiscal year 2023 to \$28.3 million in fiscal year 2024, primarily due to increases in the investments.
- Total liabilities decreased from \$9.1 million in fiscal year 2023 to \$6.7 million in fiscal year 2024, due to payments on the Series 202A and 202B Bonds.
- Total net position increased by \$4.2 million in fiscal year 2024 due to increases in investments and excess revenue over expenses.
- Total fund balance equals \$7.2 million, of which \$4.6K is restricted for bond debt service and bond revenue allocation and \$7.2 million is restricted for Urban Renewal projects.
