

# NAMPA CITY COUNCIL SPECIAL MEETING MINUTES

November 17, 2022

Mayor Kling called the meeting to order at 7:04 a.m.

Clerk made note that Councilmembers Rodriguez, Bruner, Jangula, Reynolds, Haverfield and Bower were present.

## ❖ (1) New Business ❖

**Item #1-1.** – Meeting Efficiency Recommendations for City Council Regular Meeting Agendas (Char Tim, Clerk’s Office)

Char Tim, City Clerk gave a presentation on recommendations to improve the efficiency of City Council meetings.

Decision made to keep the start time at 5:30 PM, Move public hearings up to 6:00 PM, and move most contracts and agreements from “New Business” to the “Consent Agenda”

**Item #1-2.** – Guidance on Mobile Food Vendors (i.e., Food Trucks) for the following areas:

- a. Mobile Food Vendor Code Discussion (Rodney Ashby, Planning & Zoning)
- b. Licensing/Permitting for Mobile Food Vendor (Char Tim, Clerk’s Office)

Council asked for the proposed changes to Nampa City Code be brought back for review.

**Item #1-3.** – Consideration of Alcohol Review Committee’s recommendation to revoke the City of Nampa Beer, Wine & Liquor License held by La Copa for the establishment located at 1524 1<sup>st</sup> Street North and the Consideration of an Appeal submitted by the Licensee.

Jamie Burns, Nampa Police Department presented the basis for the ARC recommendation to Council.

Kevin Dinius, 5680 East Franklin Road, Suite 130 representing La Copa presented the case for the appeal and denial of the ARC recommendation.

### Motion #1

**MOVED** by Bruner to **reduce** points total to 5.0 (2 points for no tags on bottles and .25 points for each person who did not show identification) points and that the license be suspended for one week.

MOTION DIED FOR LACK OF A SECOND

### Motion #2

**MOVED** by Reynolds and **SECONDED** by Haverfield to **deny the appeal and leave the points as assessed by the Alcohol review committee.** Mayor asked for a roll call vote with Councilmembers voting Bower, Reynolds and Jangula voting **YES** and Councilmembers Bruner, Haverfield and Rodriguez voting **NO**. The Mayor broke the tie by voting **NO**.
