SUBJECT: **Action Item:** 1st reading of Ordinance amending Nampa City Code 9-1-9 pertaining to the penalty for residing on a public Right-of-Way.

Addressing these issues is essential for ensuring the code's effectiveness and clarity.

Reason for Project:

This project is essential for enabling law enforcement officers to effectively enforce the city code and maintain the integrity of public spaces in Nampa. By providing officers with the necessary tools and guidelines, we can address the growing concern of individuals camping on the streets for extended periods.

The implementation of clear regulations and enforcement mechanisms will not only enhance the safety and accessibility of our streets but will also promote community well-being. Ensuring that public areas are free from prolonged encampments is vital for maintaining the quality of life for all residents and visitors.
